What's in a name?

The name Roselea is unique. In the local area it applies to Roselea Public School, Roselea Way, Roselea Park, Roselea Community Centre and Roselea football Club.

The land surrounding Roselea Way, Roselea Park, Roselea Public School and Carlingford High School was originally orchards. After depletion of the soil, poultry farms and rose nurseries were established on the land.

In 1910 part of the land was taken over by the Commonwealth to establish the Pennant Hills Wireless Station. This later became the AWA Wireless mast.

Rapid population growth stretched recreational playing facilities and to make maximum use of resources a co-operative effort was undertaken at Roselea. The land where the wireless mast was located was sub-divided between the Department of Education, the Catholic Church and Hornsby Shire.

The Council negotiated an agreement to form and maintain the area as playing fields which could be used by the schools during the week and the public on weekends.

Roselea Public School opened its doors in 1965.

Rose Lea means a grove of roses.

The new Club logo reflects on our heritage. The Club's original logo was a ball with wings. The new logo incorporates the ball with wings with roses to reflect the meaning of our name.



History Highlights

1967

- Club established on 25 January 1967
- Club colours were:
 - Shirts aqua with black halves
 - Shorts white
 - Socks aqua with black turn downs
- Club affiliated with GHDFA and Carlingford & District Sports Association (cost of association with CDSA was \$10)
- 13 boys from the Church of England Boys home were welcome as players.
- The club registered 4 teams U7, U7/3, U8/3 and U9/3
- The U8/3 team were Premiers
- Bill Williams donated a trophy for the team with the highest points.
- The Club had a bank balance of \$153.71 at end of year

1968

- 60 Fixture books costing \$0.20 each were purchased from GHDFA. The Club issued each family with a book.
- Seven teams were registered and managers received 3 spare pairs of laces in case of mishap.
- The Club withdrew the registration of a player when fees were not paid
- Overheard discussing our current wet spell One mother Kangaroo to her friend "I hate it when it's set in and the children have to play inside"
- A fine of \$1000 will be placed on any member not present at the 'Neville Apps' Gala Day unless Doctor's Certificate supplied
- . Bill Williams was nominated for and accepted as Life Member of the Gladesville-Hornsby Football Association. Bill also received his Referee's Ticket from the Referee's Association in England, adding yet another laurel to his credit
- Amalgamation with West Epping Soccer Club was considered following an approach. It was rejected.

1969

- the matter of Under 6 teams all wearing sandshoes or all wearing boots was resolved by G.H.F.A. in favour of boots
- The Ladies Auxiliary donated \$450.00 to the Club
- Amalgamation with West Epping Club was again raised. It was again rejected.
- Bill Williams at the age of 74 is still refereeing.

- Player fees \$1.50 plus 20 cents per game. 10 cents per half game. Family fee 50 cents.
- The Ladies Auxiliary sought the Club's approval to design a Club Banner and shirt pockets. The design was to follow that of a 'Soccer Ball with Wings' as was on the pennants presented over the past three years. The words 'Roselea Soccer Club' to

be incorporated on the Banner Approval was given and the ladies arranged to sew the pockets on all shirts. We still have this banner on our 50th birthday

• Oranges were purchased from Mr Martelli of Martellis Fruit Market

1971

- Managers were supplied with 2 pair of laces, 1 brass adaptor, 1 needle, 1 match ball and 1 tin of dubbin
- Bill Williams was honoured at a dinner held by GHFRA following his recognition as the oldest active referee in the British Commonwealth
- The Commonwealth Bank donated a 18" carriage typewriter to the Club

1972

• Amalgamation with Carlingford Redbacks was again on the agenda. This time it was Roselea initiating however the motions was defeated

1973

• First Life members awarded to Ruth Apps and Bill Williams

1974

- Late in 1974 the Club c hanged its colours to:
 - \circ $\,$ Crew neck, long sleeve shirts with vertical stripes in sky blue and navy blue
 - Navy blue shorts
 - Sky Blue socks with navy stripes on turn downs
 - Goalie shirts were marine blue

1975

• A working bee was held to make Club pennants. Equipment include a cutting knife, end caps and 150 pieces of ¼ inch dowel.

1976

• A competition was held within the Club to design a new Club Emblem suitable for sewing onto track suits, with the winning prize to be a track suit. Grant Norris won the competition and his design was used until end of 2015.

1977

• The Club shirts were altered from long sleeve to short sleeves thanks to the services of the Ladies Auxiliary

- Grading Trials were held at the Arnott's field, Homebush. Twenty five dozen cans of soft drink and twelve dozen packets of Potato Chips were ordered as refreshments for the day
- Under 6 players were permitted to play soccer in gym boots due to the difficulty of obtaining extra small soccer boots.

• A special medal was presented to Brett Pyemont in recognition of his continuous membership from Under 6 to Premier League grade

1980

- The inaugural Winfield Cup soccer match was played on 31st May between Australia and England to celebrate a century of soccer between the two countries
- GHFA banned boots with sharp studs and goalie caps with hard edges. Girls were not allowed to play in boys teams.
- Not one Roselea player appeared before the Disciplinary Committee.

1981

• A girl's competition was started by GHFA. The first girl to play for Roselea was Susan Grace Austin

1982

- Celia O'Keefe was the second girl to play for Roselea in our U/7 team. Celia scored in game against Ryde RSL
- An unfortunate goal post accident at Wood Street Oval, North Epping saw 8 members of the G.H.F.A. Executive served with Supreme Court Summons. Not all members of the G.H.F.A. Executive held insurance cover however a suitable settlement was achieved when only the members holding cover were effected

1984

- Registration fees included a compulsory premium to cover the cost of a new Group Personal Accident Insurance of \$1 for players up to 17 years and \$9 for players over 18 years.
- The Club purchased a First Aid Kit at a cost of \$78.50

1985

• At the G.H.F.A. Meeting held to discuss problems with mini-soccer, it was pointed out that mothers should not rush onto the field and kiss the Under 6's when they score goals

- Following a motion put to G.H.F.A. by Roselea Soccer Club, mini-soccer teams became differentiated by colours instead of alphabetical suffix which was considered a form of grading.
- Members were saddened by the death of Bill (Pop) Williams_on the 6th July, 1986.
 Bill Williams was a foundation member and our first President and was aged 93 when he passed away.
- Most players of the 14/1 team and 3 players from the 15/1 team together with the manager, coach and a few parents took part in an overseas trip to the U.S.A. during

December 1986. The team played six matches against American teams including Costa Mesa, Half Moon Bay and Estancia High School in California

• The Carlingford and District Sports Association was dissolved during 1986 following the winding down of its operations.

1987 – Our 21st Birthday

- For the first time our Player Registration records were computerised thanks to Allen Morris
- The Roselea Club Emblem be sewn onto each player's shirt as a means of readily identifying Club members. This was the first time that our emblem had been uniformly affixed to the Club shirts since 1973
- A 21st Anniversary Port was bottled for the occasion with distinctive label incorporation the Club emblem

1988

- The Club became an Incorporated Body under the Incorporation Act of 1984.
- The philosophy of Roselea Soccer Club was discussed at a Management meeting. In recent years we have said that we will give all players "a fair go", meaning that they are given the same opportunities to play soccer, regardless of ability. On 22nd February, 1967, at a meeting held during the Foundation Year of Roselea, the Club policy was "for all boys to have a game regardless of ability, provided they had been attending training and matches regularly" with the exception of minor qualifications which we now apply, nothing has changed in the life of the Club.

1989

- The Club played in a new design of strip, the change being made because of difficulty of purchasing existing fabric.
- The season was rather extraordinary in that apart from fielding "our greatest number of teams", we had the wettest season on record, causing atrocious ground conditions, cancellation of training and games.
- We acquired Murray Farm Oval for Saturday afternoon All Age games

1990

• The Ladies Auxiliary changed to a Social Committee in an effort to gain greater participation.

1991 – Our Silver Jubilee - 25 years

- Gained use of Harold West Reserve.
- Phantoms All Age team won our fist seniors premiership
- Four social activities
 - Car Rally and family picnic Prospect Dam 421 people
 - Family Bush Dance 316 people
 - Train Trip and lunch at Bowral 437 people

• Silver Anniversary Dinner Dance

1992

• Over 400 players registered for the first time

1993

• Difficult year due to economic down turn. Families have changed their priorities. Social Committee did not function this year

1995

- The pre-season Mini Gala Day that was great fun for the little ones,
- The Premier League Gala Day and BBQ that was a great motivational hit with the players,
- The introduction of new Tracksuits to raise the community awareness and identity of Roselea,
- A real family Presentation Day that was full of fun and activities for all ages,
- A well-attended Coaching Clinic for the Under 6,7 and 8 Mini teams,
- A new and informative Newsletter which was a great hit with all the Club Members,
- The finalising of kitting out all competitive teams in the new strip,

1996

- New high wire fence was erected at Harold West. The Club paid 1/3 of the cost with Council paying the balance
- The Social Committee held a Bush Dance for the 13 Mini teams. As reported last year 'we pencilled in a booking for Homebush Olympic Stadium' for the 30th Anniversary Dinner Dance but we were thwarted by the successful 2000 Olympic Bid and had to hold the Dinner Dance at Dural Country Club with hundreds of balloons (in Club colours) decorating not only the ceiling but each table and the stage. The Club had 25 living Life Members at that time, 16 of which were present on this occasion. Memorabilia which spanned 30 years of the Club's history was displayed and was enjoyed by all who attended.

2004

- First girls team in under 12 NWSWF competition
- First over 35 team took to the park
- Roselea Skills Squads commenced

2006

- 40th year with rain playing a significant part
- Back to Roselea Day saw many Life Members return

2007

• Record number of players this year – 531

• NWSWF Womens Club Champions

2010

- 21/1 team became Champions of Champions.
- Combined team went to New Zealand on tour

2013

- Introduction of a new playing shirt and a range of supporters gear.
- Over 35/2 Ladies were Premiers and Champions and winners of the inaugural Fred Watson trophy for Best Senior team
- The over 35/5 men's team were also Premiers and Champions
- Under 10/7 and 16/3 teams were Champions
- First charity day in support of the McGrath Foundation. All teams wore pink socks.

2014

- 3 girls from our under 10/2 team were invited to train with the NWSWF Koalas
- Resources made available to coaches through the website.
- Goal keeper training introduced.
- Charity Day in support of Beyond Blue
- 16/2 Girls and 13/3 boys teams were Premiers
- 14/2 boys were Champions

- 687 players registered with the Club including 93 ladies and girls playing in NWSWF
- We fielded 2 under 9 Girls teams, an under 23/1 and 2 over 45 men's teams
- Our MiniRoos played at Harold West Reserve for the first time. Four under 6-7 and one under 8-9 fields were set up
- Under 12/2 boys, 14/2 boys, 23/1 men's teams were Premiers and Champions
- Our over 45/4 men's team were Premiers
- The All Age 5 Ladies team were Premiers and Champions.
- Roselea finished 6th in the GHFA Club Championship our highest standing for many years
- We engaged outside consultants to run coaches courses during the year.

The Beginning

FIRST MEETING

Held on 17th January 1967 at Roselea Community Centre at 8:00pm. Intending members were:

Mr. Bollam, Mr. Goodsir, Mr. Broughton, Mr. Bedwell, Mr.Morrison, Mr. Kilgour (Referee), Mrs. Apps, Mr. Williams (Acting Chairman), Mr. Hourn (Observer) of Carlingford Sports Association, Mr. A Sandell and Mr. L. Hill representing G.H.D.F.A, and Mr. R. Hiam (Observer) of West Epping Soccer Club.

Apologies:

Mr. Apps, Mr. Seaman, Mr. Smart, Mr. Williams and Mr. Duckworth.

General Business:

Mr. A Sandell outlined the policy of the Gladesville-Hornsby District Football Association in reference to forming a club.

- (1) Officers would have to be elected before a Club could affiliate and issue Registration Forms.
- (2) It was resolved to hold a meeting on the following Wednesday, 25th January 1967 at the residence of Mr. & Mrs. Apps, 432 North Rocks Road, Carlingford at 8:00pm to elect officers for the Club.


Meeting closed 9:45pm.

*Mr. Seaman resigned as Secretary on 9th February 1967 and Mrs. R Apps was elected to the position.



The first General Meeting was held on 9th February 1967, during which Mrs. Ruth Apps was elected to the position of Hon. Secretary following the resignation of Mr. Seaman. Mr. Young was elected to the vacant position of Publicity Officer.

Roselea's affiliation with Gladesville-Hornsby District Football Association accepted and the Club colours became:

Shirts - Aqua with black halvesShorts - WhiteSocks - Black with aqua turn downs.

During March 1967 the Club south affiliation with the Carlingford and District Sports Association (C.A.D.S.A.) which was granted in May 1967 upon payment of the fee \$10.00. The Roselea Soccer Club resolved to assist the Association by manning the canteen each month.

Also during our Foundation Year, 13 boys from the Church of England Boys' Home were welcomed as players, by the Club. The generosity of a number of sponsors enabled these less privileged youngster to be equipped with uniforms and boots so that they could participate in competitive soccer. The sincere thanks of the Club was extended to the following sponsors:

We staged our Gala Day on 13th August 1967 at the pleasant surrounds of Cheltenham Oval. The function ran smoothly in the catering department thanks to the kindness of Frank Fayer for his donation of meat and the cooks. Bill Williams worked to almost non-stop the whole day.

The day eventually brought to a climax with the match between the U/7 Mums vs. U/8 and U/9 Mums, (a win to the seniors 1-0). The Men's match (2-2) following two goals from outside play by the older generation, became a moral victory for the U/7 men.

The Club registered four teams in 1967 (U/7, U7/3, U8/3 and U9/3) from 68 players and achieved a highly successful year both on the field and socially.

The U8/3 team were Premiers And U9/3 team were Runners Up.

On three occasions Club members and friends enjoyed the friendly hospitality of the Beecroft Bowling Club for social functions.

Club Emblem

At the General Meeting on 30th August, 1967, after 30 minutes or more of discussion, a vote on the Club Emblem was taken:

Vikings	-	name favoured
Flashes & Thunderbolts	-	design favoured, name not
Falcons	-	also favoured

A decision could not be reached and it was moved that pennants for 1967 be inscribed 'Roselea Soccer Club' as this was the name under which teams played. Since emblems would not be required till 1968, the decision was deferred till commencement of the 1968 season. 'Foundation Year' however was mentioned on the pennants.

Minutes of the same meeting recorded....Mr. Williams donated a Trophy for leaders with highest points in Roselea Club, to be known as the "Presidents Cup". Mr. Bedwell (Treasurer) moved that it be known as "Bill Williams Trophy".

Mr. Bedwell spoke on behalf of Members and expressed appreciation to Mr. Williams for his patience, coaching and dedication to the Club in its Foundation Year.

The Treasurer's statement showed an end-of-year balance of \$153.71.

Policy of Club

The Club Policy was for all boys to have a game regardless of ability, provided they had been attending training and matches regularly (22nd February 1967).

Mr. Adams (U8/3) reported difficulty involved in nominating players for a half game when the 4 reserves attended for a match. He suggested that in future, players would in turn stand down for a whole game. The Management Committee agreed that this would be a better policy (26th July, 1967).

However, at the Annual General Meeting on 12th February, 1968, it was moved that Club policy regarding reserves be unchanged and reserves play half game – which was carried.

Fifty Fixture Books were ordered from Gladesville-Hornsby Football Association for the Club costing 20cents each. A short time later the order was increased to sixty as it was intended to supply each family with a book.

Bryan Adams – 2nd Club President

Seven (7) Teams were registered in our second year, from U/6 to U/10 and Team Managers received 3 pairs of spare laces in case of mishaps.

A first for the Club was when Mrs. S. was informed – "....that your son, ______, has been withdrawn from this Club's Under 7 Team registered with the Gladesville-Hornsby Soccer Football Association. It is regretted that this action has been necessary, but for financial obligations, as set by the Club's Constitution, and bound by the Gladesville-Hornsby Soccer Football Association, have not been met.

The Club Bulletin of 14th May 1968 including the following comments:

*You will be pleased to know that Treasurer, Bob Bedwell, reports with a smile that at present we are financial to the tune of \$541.00 with all major accounts squared away.

* Did you know that we have 95 Registered players in the Club, including 9 boys from Havilah – did you also know that our family membership stand at 47 – (we could stand a few more??) – see your son's Team Manager, and for 50 cents you're in!

*Overheard discussing our current wet spell – One mother Kangaroo to her friend "I hate it when it's set in and the children have to play inside".

A later Bulletin advised the Gala Day has been carefully programmed for Sunday, 4th August 1968 at once again, Cheltenham Oval – scene of last year's exciting tussles between the Mums and Dads (separate games of course!).

And –

A fine of \$1000 will be placed on any member not present at the 'Neville Apps' Gala Day unless Doctor's Certificate supplied.

To assist on the Gala Day, the following request:-

- (a) Mothers of the 'Evens' (U/6, U/8 & U/10) to bring a loaf of assorted sandwiches.
- (b) Mothers of the 'Odds' (U/7 & U/9) to bring a plate of small cakes or scones.

The 1968 season concluded with the U9/2 team being Runners-Up in the Premiership and Champions. Bill Williams was nominated for and accepted as Life Member of the Gladesville-Hornsby Football Association. Bill also received his Referee's Ticket from the Referee's Association in England, adding yet another laurel to his credit.

<u>Amalgamation</u>

The West Epping Soccer Club wrote to Roselea on 15th July, 1968 advising that at their recent meeting a motion was passed – "that we approach Roselea Soccer Club to amalgamate."

Our reply of 23rd August, 1968 indicated –"...the matter was discussed at length by the Management Committee and its recommendation placed before a General Meeting. It was the wish of this meeting to advise " it is felt that the basic differences in Club administration and maturity, in that Roselea is still a 'young' Club, preclude amalgamation at this date...."

Carlingford News

The 'Carlingford News' issue of March 1968, published by the Carlingford Progress Association, listed the following Club/s Associations:

Roselea Community Centre Association Carlingford and District Sports Association West Epping Soccer Club (A Division of C.A.D.S.A.) Roselea Soccer Club "Roselea" Physical Culture Club "Roselea" Ladybirds Basketball Club (A Division of C.A.D.S.A.) Cricket Club "Roselea" Table Tennis Club.

1969

Club Uniform

A change of uniform was sought and approved by the Association as:

All aqua short sleeved shirt with black trim and sleeves. Shorts remained white. Socks also unchanged, black with aqua tops.

The walkathon to raise money held on 15th May was a great success with more than 20 mothers participating. All competed 7 miles, with some eager beavers walking the perimeter of Roselea Oval to make up the 8 mile originally decided upon.

The Gala Day was held on 29th June at Cheltenham Oval which was combined with the Roselea Ladybirds (our round ball sisters) and a tremendous day resulted. The Ladybirds played basketball while soccer was played on the filed against visiting Clubs.

Our Presentation Day was held during October also at Cheltenham Oval.

Earlier, the matter of Under 6 teams all wearing sandshoes or all wearing boots was resolved by G.H.F.A. in favour of boots.

To many people the task of refereeing 14 games of school soccer during the week and then a further 6 or 7 at the weekend would be well beyond them. However, this is not the case with 74 year old Bill 'Pop' Williams. Mr. Williams is one of the keenest referees belonging to Gladesville-Hornsby Soccer Football Association. He has an almost fanatical love of the game. Not content with refereeing many high school games throughout the week, he turns round and spends his weekends – just on Saturday. On Sunday he takes time off from refereeing – so he can coach and manage the association's U/10 representative side.

Born in Liverpool, England, Mr. Williams has had almost a lifelong association with the game. He was at one stage ball boy for the powerful Everton side. By the way, in summer Mr. Williams relaxes from soccer by coaching junior cricket in the morning and umpiring B grade matches in the afternoon.

An invitation from Dundas United Soccer Club for us to field an Old Buffer's Team on 2nd May had to be refused as it clashed with our Gala Day.


The Hawaiian Supper Dance held at Beecroft Bowling Club on 3rd April was attended by 114 members and resulted in a pleasant, relaxing evening.




Photo - Trevor Atkins - Club President 1971-1972

Roselea Amenities Centre

The following items have been extracted from local Newspapers issued during 1980.

After much controversy the plans submitted by Redbacks Soccer Club were confirmed by Hornsby Shire Council. Roselea Soccer Club opposed the plans as did the Roselea Reserve Action Committee. Roselea Soccer Club stated that the proposed building has insufficient toilets, no space for lock-up storage, an inadequate canteen and undersized meeting room. The Roselea Reserve Action Committee wanted the initial work on the building foundations filled in.

Headline "Campaign forces halt on Building" – This action follows a fierce campaign by nearby residents who claim the Council acted illegally in allowing Redbacks to build a private club house on public recreation land. Hornsby Councillor, Bill Hodson, this week angrily refuted accusations that he should have declared an interest in the Redbacks Soccer Club furore. On ABC's "City Extra" radio programme it was suggested he should have declared his position as Patron of the Redbacks.

Hornsby Council has withdrawn permission for the Carlingford Redbacks Soccer Club to build a club house at Roselea Oval.

However a club house will still be built on the site for the use of all interested sporting bodies.

The NSW Attorney General, Mr. Walker, has this week intervened on behalf of Carlingford residents against Hornsby Council in the Roselea Park controversy. The Council backed down by deciding to go ahead with the building at its own expense and naming it the Roselea Park Amenities Block. The Council will be asked to give a formal undertaking before the Supreme Court that no sporting group, club or team shall use the premises for meetings and functions. The Council must also agree to provide public toilets, canteen, storeroom and assembly room in the building.

During 1988, all teams were sponsored by local businesses, many of whom are also Club members. We are very appreciative of the financial support given by all sponsors.

The philosophy of Roselea Soccer Club was discussed at a Management Meeting this year. Roselea has a Sister Club relationship with the Half Moon Bay Club in San Francisco and our players will billeted with American families during part of the trip. They will be bringing the Roselea Cup home again following its residence in Half Moon Bay since our American friends visited us in July last year. We envisage a Roselea team going to the USA every two years, with Half Moon Bay travelling to Australia on alternate years.
