TOUR RULES AND GUIDELINES

Sports tours form a valuable part of the opportunities available for players of the [Roselea Football Club](#) and contribute significantly to the enjoyment of the sport.

The Club believes that tours can give players the opportunities they would otherwise not have had, and also help in promoting our Club to the wider football community.

Sports tours motivate players, build team and club spirit and stimulate improvement in sport. As such, there are expectations regarding player conduct and behaviour.

RESPECT PROGRAM

Roselea FC has adopted and is promoting the RESPECT Program. We are proud to say that Roselea FC is taking a leading role in this campaign. We have been involved in the development of the program, which will continue to roll out over the next few years.

We have made a commitment to encourage positive behaviour by showing RESPECT to all participants in our beautiful game, whether it is as a player, coach, referee or spectator. Our jerseys have a RESPECT logo on the right arm. This has been done to show our commitment to the program.

The aim of the program is to promote respect of:

- The match officials, without whom the game would be much less enjoyable
- The opposition, without whom there would be no game
- The rules, which keep the game fair and safe
- Yourself, set yourself standards and stick to them no matter what the opposition does



Below are the Gorilla Champions Cup Tour Rules and Guidelines.

Each player must read and agree to the following:

GORILLA CHAMPIONS CUP

Touring Players' Code of Behaviour

- Be a good sport
- Play for enjoyment
- Strive for personal excellence
- Work hard for your team as well as yourself
- Treat all team mates and opponents as you enjoy being treated yourself
- Play by the rules
- Co-operate with team and game officials
- Control your behaviour on and off the field
- Learn to value honest effort, skilled performance and improvement

In addition, ALL players must ...

- Be welcoming and inclusive of all members of the touring party including other Roselea FC players, guest players, Tour Officials and supporters
- Show respect for other people, their personal rights and their property at all times
- Adhere to the Club's Policy on uniform and playing strip appropriate to the tour, including the correct wearing of it
- Not enter into any other players sleeping area. Communal areas are the only areas where eating and social activities may occur, unless otherwise directed by Tour Management Group (TMG) members
- Remain in their sleeping areas after the "Lights Out" time designated by supervising staff



- Always travel with a buddy when moving around the grounds, the tour accommodation or when out in Surfers Paradise.
- Always stay within the confines of agreed venues and locations
- Ensure responsible, appropriate & legal use of social media & electronic devices including adhering to;
 - All reasonable TMG directions about the use of electronic & social media devices
 - Surrender all electronic & social media devices for secure storage as, and when directed by any TMG member
 - Mobile phones, music players and electronic devices will be confiscated if inappropriately used
 - NO photos are to be taken in bedrooms or bathrooms

CO-OPERATION, players MUST ...

- Follow the instructions and directions from Coaches, Managers, TMG members and other appropriate adults (including Gorilla Champions Cup Officials, Referees, accommodation & catering staff etc) politely and immediately and without argument
- Be required for specific duties (packing and unpacking, laundry, tidying up etc) as directed - participation in these duties is compulsory

PARTICIPATION AND ATTENDANCE, players will ...

- Participate positively in all activities
- Refrain from disrupting or otherwise interfering with any parts of the tour, tour activities or any other person's enjoyment of the tour
- Attend all matches, match preparations, team sessions and other scheduled activities, and all meals at the agreed times
- Travel to and from all matches with the team (unless specific arrangements have been approved between parents and the TMG)

Exemption from these activities and events is

only by permission of a supervising TMG member



- Remain with the **Roselea FC** Tour Group for the duration of the tour unless with the explicit permission of a TMG member, after been signed out by a parent

- Family “out of tour” activities
 - Players must be signed out by parents/caregivers for any player to attend “out of tour” activities with family
 - Players must be signed back in upon return
 - Parents must give an estimated time of return before departure

- Attendance at Team meetings is compulsory and players are not permitted to leave until permission is given to do so. This also includes at meal sittings

- Bedtime curfew. This is important for rest and rehabilitation ready for the next day
 - In rooms and lights out as directed by Tour Officials on a day-to-day basis.
 - Devices will be collected prior to lights out.



PROPERTY, players will be responsible for ...

- All of their own personal property & clothes while on tour
- All club equipment and property
- All equipment, property and furnishings in our place of accommodation
- Pay for all damages, losses, and breakages that they incur
- Players are expected to leave their rooms and common areas in a tidy and well ordered state, respecting the property of others





NON-COMPLIANCE OF GORILLA CHAMPIONS CUP TOUR RULES AND GUIDELINES

Inappropriate behaviour will be dealt with in a variety of ways including;

- 1. Reprimands for minor offences**
- 2. Suspension from matches at the discretion of their team coach**
- 3. For serious offences the parent(s) will be contacted and asked to collect the student, or the student will be sent home via commercial transport (at a cost to the parents)**
- 4. Mobile phones, music players and electronic devices will be confiscated if inappropriately used**

Individuals may face disciplinary action for sending inappropriate electronic communication or posting online content or comments that harass, offend, intimidate or humiliate another member. Under certain circumstances, cyber bullying (e.g. bullying that is carried out through an internet service such as email, a chat room, discussion group, instant messaging or website) is a criminal offence that can be reported to the police.

In addition, members who publish false or misleading comments about another person in the public domain (e.g., Facebook, YouTube or Twitter) may be liable for defamation.
